Other developments from September 2021

Improving the pupils' Learning and Experience in the classroom



YUB is the first secondary school to move fully to having 75" and 86" screens in every classroom. These replace the white boards and the interactive whiteboards. This equipment has the latest technology, and our staff have already received training to use them, there is strong evidence to suggest that the teaching is more effective and that the children enjoy the experience.

The Pandemic has meant that we have had to use the latest technology both at home and at work over the internet, and now we are using the latest technology at school. In order to respond to the challenge of having 50 new wi-fi enable screens and 700+ chromebooks at school we are pleased to see the broadband speed is increasing.

Restore and Excel Programme

This has been a difficult year, and we are currently in the process of ensuring that our improvement programme continues apace next year. From September we will be launching our support centre for pupils and intend to increase capacity in order to support the wellbeing and inclusion of our pupils.

I have already stated our investment in the latest technology to improve the learning, and we will be focusing on improving all our assessment and tracking strategies so that you as parents and pupils will be fully aware of your child's progress and more importantly the steps for improvement. We will also be placing further focus on the 5 Questions.



Questions for the teachers themselves:

- 1. What am I teaching?
- 2. Why am I teaching it?
- 3. How will I teach it?
- 4. How will I know when students have learned or not?
- 5. What is next ... if this works? If it doesn't work? Where do I go for help?

Questions for parents to ask teachers:

- 1. What is my child learning?
- 2. How is she/he doing?
- 3. How do you know how she/he is doing?
- 4. How can she/he
 improve?
- 5. What support can I provide and can you provide if she/he is struggling? When will we check in again?

Questions for parents to ask at home daily:

- 1. What did you learn today?
- 2. How did you do?
- 3. What did you do if you didn't understand?
- 4. How can you improve on your learning?
- 5. What are you most proud of?

School Uniform

Since the lockdown period we as a school have tried to help avoid the worry of having to buy a new school uniform for a short period of time with the expectation that your child will grow during the summer and the added cost. We have lowered our expectations on school uniform substantially and under the circumstances we believe that this was the right thing to do.

However, from September we will be returning to the usual rules regarding school uniform. Our suppliers' information is on our website. I look forward to seeing everyone back in perfect uniform and believe this will help get us back to some form of normality.





Throughout the term we have been holding class forums with the pupils and it's interesting to see that the pupils are also keen to re-establish school rules in relation to the uniform.

I fully understand the cost implications, and if anyone has any concern please do not hesitate to contact me personally. I am also more than willing to open a consultation on the school uniform.

MOBILE PHONES

Currently, we have no intention to completely ban mobile phones. We feel that this would be unduly unfair on the majority who use their phones wisely and responsibly. However, the use of mobile phones in the classroom has presented us with a substantial challenge.

Therefore, from September we intend to do the following:

- * No pupil requires a mobile phone, but if they do bring them to school then the phone must only be used during break and lunchtime.
- * Bringing a phone to school is the child's risk, we will not take any responsibility for any damage etc.
- * If any pupil uses a mobile phone during lessons without permission, we will ask the child to give their phone to the teacher for safe keeping and we will agree a return method. We will share our plans on how to return mobile phones in September.
- * I kindly ask for your co-operation with this matter, there is no need for mobiles at school, particularly social media.



FOOD AND DRINK

Thank you all for your support this year which has presented many challenges when providing food and drink to our pupils. We are excited to announce that a new catering company will be providing food and drink here at the school from September. During my initial meetings with the company Chartwells we are excited to see their menus and look forward to returning to providing our usual compliment of hot and cold food. We are currently hoping to be able to serve refreshments during break times.

We are also in the planning stages for providing further eating areas which will be better for the pupils during lunchtimes. I look forward to sharing these with you in the near future.

We will not be allowing pupils to bring energy drinks to school. The classroom forums also agree with this. I ask again for your co-operation with this matter.

We are facing considerable challenges between now and the end of term, and in addition to the recent cyber-attack this has meant that we have had to shut down our on-line payment facility. Please accept our apologies for this inconvenience however the matter is completely out of our control.

Improving Communication and Celebrating Success

Due to the recent cyber-attack and lack of software, we have been unable to produce our latest video, however we will be commissioning a new video in September.

During the year, our website has developed and we continue to increase our communications and celebrate our successes on Facebook.


From September, we will continue to improve our communication strategies. We will be extending our school opening hours to 5pm and there will be a member of staff available to take your enquiries until then.
