

22/03/2022 - YEAR 10 - All day activity

4 presenters each working with a group for the day covering the Hit the Mark programme. Interactive and motivational workshop which will encourage pupils to dismiss any negative thoughts. This will raise achievement and help them gain the results they deserve.

24/03/2022 - YEAR 12 & 13 - All day activity

4 presenters working with groups for the day on Further Study Skills. The transition from KS4 to KS5 is a big leap and the course will offer ideas on independent study, time management and organisation.

"The transition from KS4 to KS5 is one of the biggest leaps students will make in their education, and that is without the added pressures COVID has brought on our students. Some students thrive with the extra freedom and responsibility, but many more struggle.

Our motivational and inspiring Advanced Study Skills workshop equips Year 12 or Year 13 students with effective learning strategies so they can grow to be successful, independent and resilient learners.

The programme looks at content including:

- * Independent Learning, Time Management and Organisation * Note-taking and Condensing information
 - * Association Maps * Effective Reading * Research Skills
- * The Review Philosophy, including Spaced Practice * Stress Management and Procrastination *Growth Mindset and Motivation



FENCE

YEAR 9 TIMETABLE AND THE CURRICULUM

Following the success from last year we will adapt the year 9 curriculum and timetable after Easter. We intend to formally start GCSE courses in the core subjects of Welsh, English, Science and Maths, and for the remaining lessons the pupils will work thematically in groups to prepare for their other GCSEs. After the Whitsun break, they will be studying towards their GCSEs in all the subjects.
